

# Let's go animal spotting.....

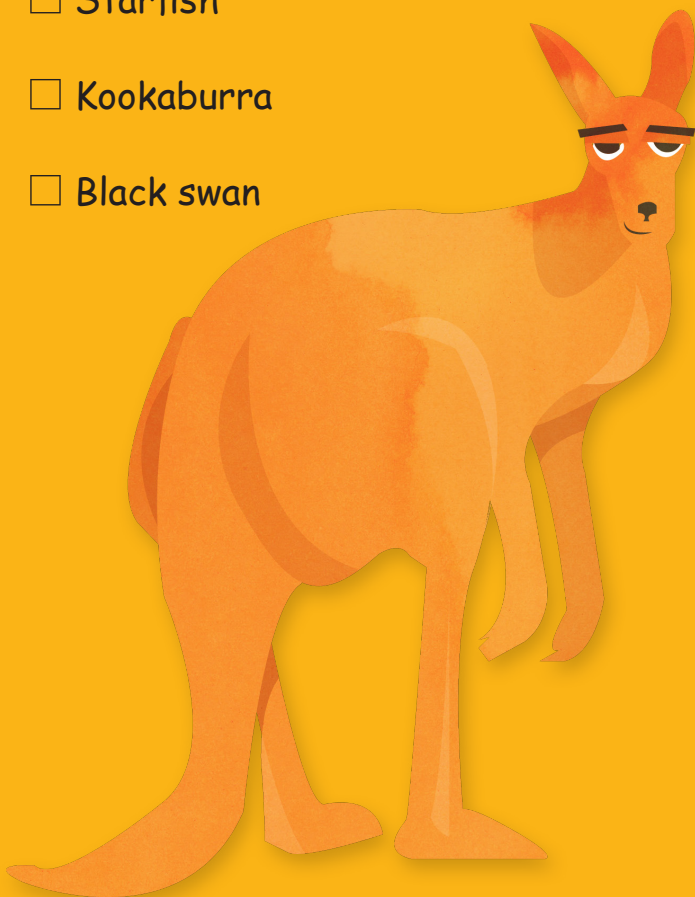
Queenscliff is home to many native animals - some you may never have encountered before.
